DUBAI



Dubai is the most populous city in the **United Arab Emirates** and the capital of the Emirate of Dubai. BURJ KHALIFA



The Burj Khalifa is the tallest man-made structure in the world, rising to an incredible **828 meters** above the city of Dubai. **Completed in 2010**, it has become an international symbol of ambition, progress, and modern engineering. Designed by the American architectural firm Skidmore, Owings & Merrill, the building features a sleek design inspired by Islamic architecture and the desert flower Hymenocallis. Visitors can explore its observation decks on the **124th, 125th, and 148th floors**, which offer stunning panoramic views of the city, the desert, and the Arabian Gulf. **The tower is home to luxury residences, offices, restaurants, and the Armani Hotel.** Illuminated at night with spectacular light shows, the Burj Khalifa is not only a record-breaking skyscraper but also a cultural icon and one of the most visited attractions in Dubai.

DESERT SAFARI



The Desert Safari is one of Dubai's most unique and unforgettable experiences, offering visitors a journey into the heart of the **Arabian Desert**. The adventure often begins with an exhilarating **4x4 drive across rolling sand dunes**, a thrilling activity known as dune bashing. Guests also have the chance to **enjoy camel rides, sandboarding, and quad biking, immersing themselves in the desert landscape**. As evening falls, the safari continues in traditional Bedouin-style camps where visitors can savor **Arabic cuisine, watch cultural performances such as belly dancing and tanoura shows, and enjoy the serene beauty of the desert night sky**. The Desert Safari captures both the excitement and tradition of life in the Emirates, making it **a must-do activity for anyone wishing to experience the cultural and natural beauty of Dubai**.

MUSEUM OF THE FUTURE



The Museum of the Future is one of Dubai's most remarkable architectural and cultural landmarks, celebrated as a hub for innovation and imagination. Officially opened in 2022, the building itself is an engineering masterpiece—an elliptical structure covered with Arabic calligraphy that represents quotes about the future.
