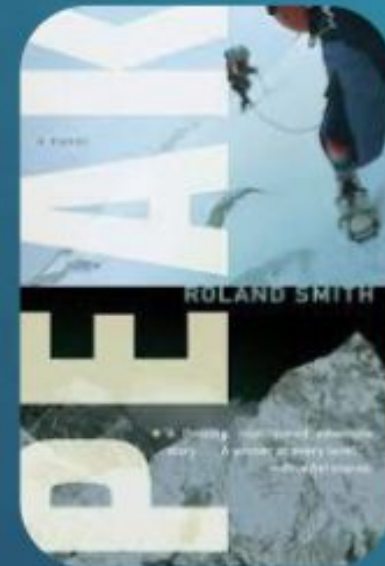

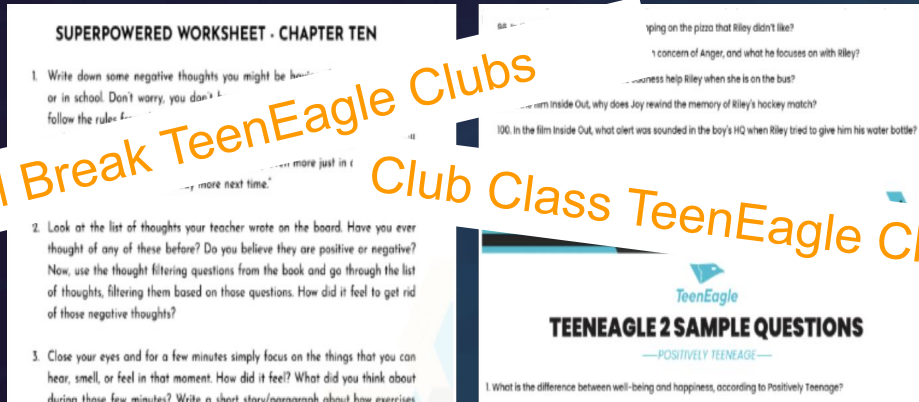

#### Lesson Outline (120 Minutes)

##### 1. Warm-Up (15 minutes) – Personal Reflection & Prediction

Objective: Engage students in reflecting on the themes of hope and perseverance.

  - How did you feel? Did you hope to see them again?
