* The state is home to many iconic landmarks, such as the **Statue of Liberty**, , **Central Park**, **Empire State Building**, and **Niagara Falls**.

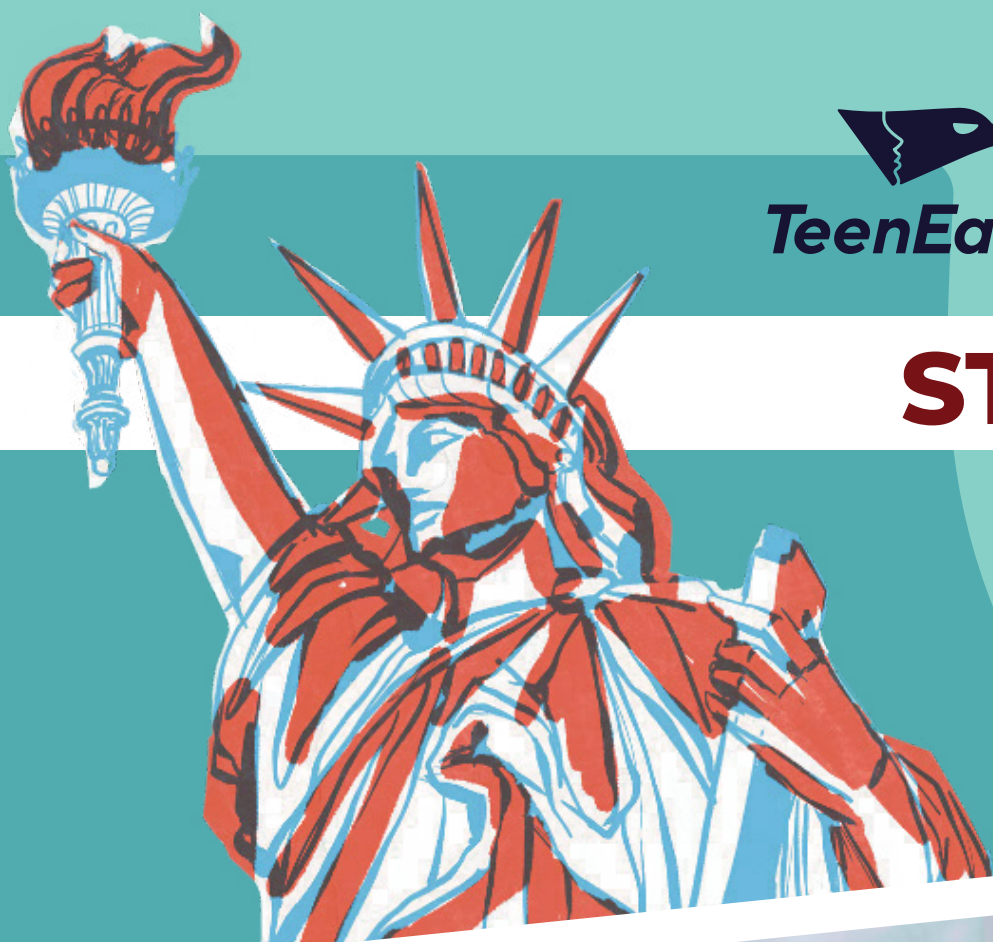

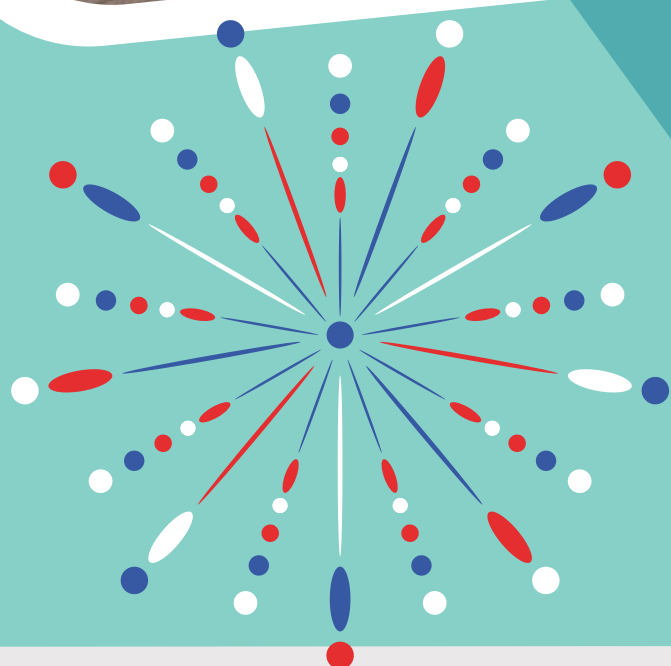
SUMMIT ONE VANDERBILT

STATUE OF LIBERTY



The Statue of Liberty is a colossal neoclassical sculpture on Liberty Island in New York Harbor in New York City, in the United States. It is widely known as **the most iconic structure in the world**. The statue became an icon of freedom and of the United States, being subsequently seen as a **symbol of welcome to immigrants arriving by sea**.

CENTRAL PARK



Designed by Frederick Law Olmsted and Calvert Vaux, Central Park influenced the development of urban parks nationwide and is widely regarded as a masterpiece of landscape architecture. **It has eight lakes and ponds that were created artificially** by damming natural seeps and flows. Central Park is full of attractions, from green meadows to sprawling waters, **gardens and unique bridges**, music and performance centers, educational facilities, classical architecture and more. Its picturesque beauty boasts natural green landscapes and vistas as far as the eye can see.

TIMES SQUARE
